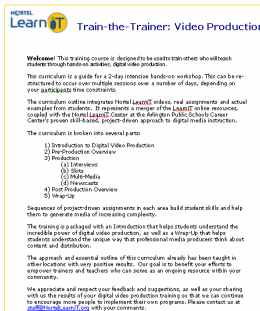
Volunteer to help set up the equipment, explore its use with the teachers or trainers. Invite your colleagues to lend a hand; work alongside the kids as coaches.
